2013 – MEDAL OF ENGINEERING EXCELLENCE FOR DISTINGUISHED ACHIEVEMENT SERVICE OF HUMANITY

Award Criteria: The recipient will be chosen based on his or her noteworthy contributions to the practice, theory, or public status of engineering. Nominees should possess appreciable experience in the profession, international standing as well as significant educational accomplishments.

2013 – MEDAL OF EXCELLENCE IN ENGINEERING EDUCATION

Award Criteria: The recipient will be chosen based on his or her noteworthy contributions to the improvement of engineering education. Special consideration will be given to outstanding services rendered by educators to engineering educational institutions, and to those involved in the education of engineers. Nominees should possess appreciable experience in the profession as well as significant educational accomplishments.

INFORMATION ON BOTH AWARDS

The Award recipient shall be an engineer as defined by the relative standards of the nominating WFEO member organization.

Nominations, using the enclosed two-page nomination form and following its instructions, must be submitted by May 31, 2013, to the Executive Director, WFEO. The WFEO Awards Committee will make its recommendation on this Award to the WFEO Executive Council for ratification. The Award recipient will be notified and, on acceptance, the news media will be informed.

The Award will be presented in Singapore at the WFEO Gala dinner on 13 September 2013 during the General Assembly meetings, where the award recipient would give a brief presentation on a topic related to the basis of the nomination.



THE MEDAL OF ENGINEERING EXCELLENCE FOR DISTINGUISHED ACHIEVEMENT IN THE SERVICE OF HUMANITY

The first presentation of the World Federation of Engineering Organisations (WFEO) Medal (the Engineering Achievement Award) was made in September 1989 in Prague, Czechoslovakia, during the 12th General Assemble of WFEO. The Medal was to be presented biennially hereafter, helping direct world attention to the practice, theory and public contributions of engineering. There is no honorarium on stipend associated with the award.

THE MEDAL OF EXCELLENCE IN ENGINEERING EDUCATION

The first presentation of the World Federation of Engineering Organizations (WFEO) Medal for Excellence in Engineering Education was made in Madrid, Spain, in November 1999, during the 18th General Assembly of WFEO. The Medal was to be presented biennially hereafter, helping direct world attention to the importance of continuing improvement in the quality, delivery and relevance of engineering education and training. There is no honorarium or stipend associated with the award.

THE WORLD FEDERATION OF ENGINEERING ORGANIZATIONS

n the 4th March, 1968, representatives of 50 scientific and technical associations from all over the world met under the auspices of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) in Paris to establish the World Federation of Engineering Organisations (WFEO). WFEO's charter as an international, non-governmental organisation is to unite multidisciplinary engineering associations throughout the world, with as essential goals:

- To provide information and leadership to the engineering profession on issues of concern to the public or the profession;
- To serve society, and to be recognised, by national and international organisations and the public, as a respected and valuable source of advice and guidance on the policies, interests and concerns that relate engineering and technology to the human and natural environment;
- To make information on engineering available to the countries of the world and to facilitate communication through its member nations;
- To foster peace, socio-economic security and sustainable development among all countries of the world, through the proper application of technology;
- To facilitate relationships between governments, business and people by contributing an engineering dimension to discussions on policies and investments.
